#### **Notes on Extra Materials for Master Beef Producer Marketing Session**

- 1. Focus on Feedlots from Kansas State we use this when discussing what feedlots can pay for TN feeder cattle and the "rules of thumb" on changes in feeder cattle price. We normally point out the average cost of gain for those cattle marketed in the month of the report and the projected cost of gain for cattle placed on feed that month. One thing to note, the feedlots represented on this report happen to feed more heifers than steers and are very good at managing heifers on feed. This impact can occasionally be seen in the death loss for heifers being lower than for steers. The lower gain on heifers and higher feed requirements are reflected in the higher cost of gain which is one reason heifers sell cheaper than steers. - 2. Next is the weekly summary report for TN auctions. The weekly summary report has been modified from what you will find on the web. We have deleted out the slaughter cows and bulls normally listed and have added price slides on the M&L 1&2 steers and bulls and comparisons between different grades and sex of cattle. You can do this for a more recent report. You can find a link to the weekly summary report at <a href="https://www.tnbeefcattleinitiative.org/curmkt.htm">www.tnbeefcattleinitiative.org/curmkt.htm</a> Save the file (it is a text file) and then open it in Word or WordPerfect. Once you have it in Word or WordPerfect, you can select what you want to delete from the summary and add in the price slides and comparisons as we have done on the example. We use this when discussing feeder cattle grades. We have a price slide to help more accurately price cattle without the exact weight being known, i.e. a video sale or direct sale from the farm. It can change over time depending on the cost of feedlot gain relative to the selling price for the cattle.
- 3. The grid sheet is from TN cattle in the Tennessee Beef Evaluation program finished in Iowa through the Tri-County Steer Carcass Futurity. We use the grid sheet to demonstrate the importance of not producing those extremes in frame and muscle grades - large frame cattle take longer to finish and have heavier carcasses which are discounted while small frame cattle finish quickly and have small carcasses which are discounted. Also, we note the Choice/Select spread at that time. We recommend that producers strive to produce cattle that are medium frame and will grade Choice in the carcass. If an animal grades Prime, it is a bonus but this is not what most producers should be striving to do because of the cost and risk. Also, on this particular sheet there is a discount for a heiferette, i.e., a heifer over 30 months of age or what is sometimes called a hard-bone. The light muscled cattle would be dairy crosses. We sometimes include in the margin the price spread between the different quality grades and different yield grades. Also, we point out the CAB premium and the Age Verification premium for cattle that would be expected to be harvested at less than 21 months of age. On this grid we have calculated the live weight equivalent for the carcass weights listed by dividing the carcass weight by 0.63 (63% dressing percentage). We talk about the grid sheet with the slide titled "Strive to Produce" to illustrate the second point - avoid extremes.
- 4. The final sheet is a page from a video sale catalog. We use this when discussing video board sales advantages and disadvantages. This is just to give those who have not seen a catalog

sheet an understanding in what is included and how important a good description of the cattle is to the buyer. You can also draw a comparison between the two groups described and discuss the reasoning for the difference in prices - one set is lighter weight causing some increase in price - with a 4 cent sliding scale, about \$3 per hundred of the price difference is due to weight alone. They are also age and source verified which adds value, also slightly more uniform in grade and they are weaned and preconditioned which also adds value.
