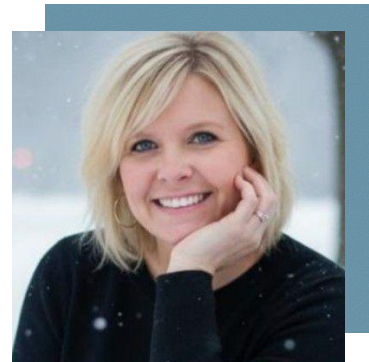


AGRICULTURE

She manages the Northeast TN Master Gardener Association, which has members from both Sullivan and four surrounding counties. NETMGA is actively involved with various educational demonstrations and events throughout the year to serve as the outreach arm for consumer horticulture in Sullivan County. 2026 Tennessee Extension Master Gardener training is conducted January-April.

Melody is also excited about offering programming in beekeeping, pollinator plots, Smart Yards, homesteading, home fruits and vegetables, lawns, landscapes, home orchards, herbs, and companion plants.

Melody also serves on the statewide University of Tennessee horticulture team (UTHort), which provides various educational events, programs, and field days each year for the consumer horticulture audience, including home garden variety trials.

Since joining Extension, Megan has diligently worked to acquire necessary training and certifications to offer various types of requested programming to the people of Sullivan County, Kingsport, Bristol, and other neighboring areas. She has also made connections with various local agencies and organizations to assist in serving the population, with her most notable achievement being a recent appointment to the Sullivan County Health Council.

When she is not working, Megan and her family are very involved in their church, Embreeville Church of Christ. She also enjoys traveling, reading, cross-stitching, hand embroidery, and cooking.

Upcoming Programming

Health Education for Diabetes- new cohorts will begin in late March! This program is an excellent resource for anyone who has a diagnosis of Diabetes Type 1 or 2. It has no other requirements aside from a diagnosis, and it is completely free.

Diabetes Prevention Program- This nationally-recognized, research-based program is for anyone with a pre-diabetes diagnosis who has an interest in keeping themselves from becoming a diabetic. The program is completely free, and will take one year to complete. The program is planned to start in March, pending completion of Megan's training.

Parenting Apart: Effective Co-Parenting- This research-based, educational program fulfills the TN State Requirement for divorcing individuals in regards to a parent education program. It provides information and education to help parents better understand the basics of child development in regards to emotions, while also teaching parents how to work together for the good of everyone in the situation, despite being separated. The cost for this program is \$55.

Other upcoming programming, pending scheduling and training- Dining with Diabetes, Preparing Your Child for Kindergarten, Food Preservation classes, Sewing classes, Everybody Gets Older (EGO)- a program about healthy living for seniors, Chair Yoga, and more! TENNESSEE CONSUMER EDUCATION PROGRAM (TNCEP)

TNCEP is a federally funded nutrition program that has touched the lives of many Sullivan County residents since its implementation here. Unfortunately, due to federal shut-down late last year (2025), Susan was on furlough for several weeks. Upon her return, numerous programs have been scheduled, including youth programs for elementary age AND teenagers continues in January.

Susan can be seen on live segments via Daytime Tri Cities each second Thursday of the month. These segments promote nutrient dense foods, wise use of food budget and food storage as well as promote our UTIA Extension programming. Susan has also scheduled for early summer cooking camps at Kingsport YMCA and Boys Club Girls Club. Additionally, Blountville Library is hosting two intro sessions for Drums Alive.

Lastly, this very important nutrition education program concludes June 30, again due to lack of federally funded appropriations, but in the interim, Sullivan County TNCEP is supporting other TNCEP programs by sharing surplus materials. As a total Extension program, we will miss this effective program.

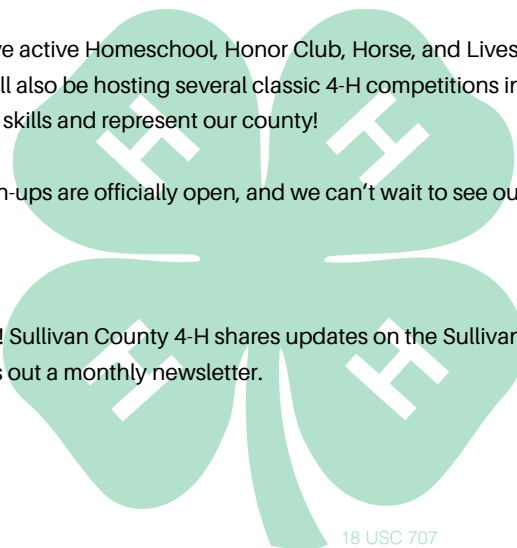
Stay Connected With Sullivan County 4-H

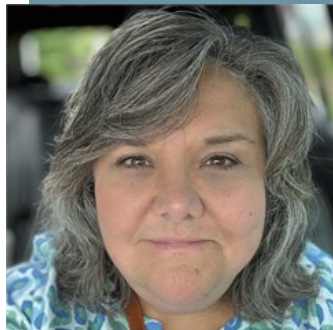
